

Dear colleagues,

On behalf of the board of the Belgian Society of Gastrointestinal Endoscopy, I'm happy to invite you to our annual symposium 2008 which will be held in Gembloux.

The theme of this year's symposium will be "From everyday endoscopic practice to challenging clinical conditions".

We will start from our daily routine practice of endoscopy and address the following question: in what conditions and with which infrastructure do we practice endoscopy in our country? The results of a national survey will be presented as introduction to the symposium. This will be followed by a lecture on the conception of an up-to-date endoscopy unit.

We are looking forward to seeing you in Gembloux and hope that you will take the time to enjoy the historical interest of the place, only a few steps away from the center of our country.
